From the President

Recently, the EVA has been working with EVER group to redevelop the Township Playground area near the Puffing Billy station. We have received a great deal of input which will be used to drive the planning. The Shire has set aside funds to start the much needed development of this area.

Several objections (including the EVA's) to the medical centre project on 337 Belgrave Gembrook Rd have been received by the Shire. The design of the building, its appropriateness and traffic are key issues.

During the next month ECHO is conducting a survey to determine health needs in our community. The EVA is supporting this process.

The EVA now has over 160 members. Our aim is to be the voice of Emerald (but not the only one). To ensure that we do truly represent the local community we do need regular input from our members and the wider community. Please forward any views or issues that we can advocate for to improve our town.

At our last meeting we were briefed on the Shire's Emergency Plan. If we have another major weather event or a bushfire what happens? A concern is the state of the various access roads in and out of Emerald. Your views would be most welcome.

Anzac Day

The Emerald RSL is gearing up for the annual Anzac Day services and march on Tuesday April 25th.

Once again Emerald will be adorned in poppies - a tradition now prior to Anzac Day and Remembrance Day every year.

This year the theme on Anzac Day will be the National Service Conscription ballot that commenced in 1965 and the Vietnam War. This year commemorates 50 years since the withdrawal of Australian troops from South Vietnam in 1973.

The dawn service commences at 5.30am at Anzac Place. The bag-pipes will welcome residents and visitors from afar followed by the sounds of warfare and the ringing of the Anzac bell that sits outside St Marks in Memorial Avenue. Puffing Billy will salute in traditional fashion.

The community groups of Emerald will march from town centre at 10.30am to Anzac Place for the morning service.

Students from both the EPS and the ESC will take the podium with speeches about Vietnam and National Service. After the service everyone is welcome at the RSL for refreshments and footy from the "G".

On the Saturday prior, the 22nd April, the Emerald Football and Netball Club will feature in the Anzac Day clash against Seville at Chandler Reserve. As per previous tradition, the Anzac Medals will be presented to Best on Ground and Court.

EVA Community Meeting

At our last committee meeting we had a guest from the Council. Stewart Matulis, Coordinator Emergency Management, spoke about our Local Response Plan and Teams. Specifically, he helped us understand how various organisations work together to prepare for and respond to emergencies or disasters in particular in this area. Pepi's Land is Emerald's safe place in the event of bushfire - (Woollies underground car park doesn't meet full criteria). Roads out of Emerald will not be safe due to the number of trees in our area – we are in a green wedge after all! Leaving early is key, including on days when the risk is rated Catastrophic.

In the event of significant destruction of property, Council applies for funds from governments and seek expressions of interest from local organisations to be on a Community Recovery Committee which will be responsible for distributing funds to rebuild communities.

In lesser emergencies, Council is responsible for opening relief shelters etc.

Stewart Matulis also reminded us of the "Creating Cardinia" website where feedback can always be given on current projects. It's always current, with whatever the council is seeking feedback about at the moment. https://creating.cardinia.vic.gov.au/

On a lighter note, the multicultural intergenerational event "Tell Me Your Story" (EVA's Well-being Project using a grant from Cardinia Council) was a great success. Read about this heart-warming event in the separate article. Our "Gather and Grow" Garden project at the Emerald Primary School also funded by the Cardinia Council is now up and running successfully.

EVA's next Committee Meeting will be at 7:30pm, 26th April at the Hub, with invited guests from ECHO - CEO Nicole Lane and Researcher Megan Oshri, to discuss their community survey initiative. As always all are welcome to join us.

ECH current short course program caters for those who want to work with their hands, whether it is writing stories, cooking, crafting clay or digging in the garden. Childcare Programs have been steadily growing with parents returning to work or moving into the area. First Aid is set for April 22 and is a requirement for many volunteers and staff in the hills.

The Emerald Messenger has reinvented itself to help another hills community start-up journal.

Developing a Community Newspaper course is now fully subscribed with a new wave of aspiring hills journalists benefitting from the Emerald Messenger learnings. ECH supports the hills community to stretch their shrinking dollar. We provide free food (frozen and non-perishables) to the broader hills community from Food Bank resources, Woolworths and the Cockatoo Bakery. The Emerald Community Market continues to operate on the 3rd Sunday of the month.

ECH's registration with Centrelink for volunteers helps their clients meet their mutual obligations. We also utilise tertiary placement students as volunteers to provide the experience that they require to meet their education goals.

Tell Me a Story- an Intergenerational/ Intercultural Gathering at the Hub.

It was a dark and stormy morning...sounds like the start of a great story and it was!

The almost black skies were throwing down torrents of rain and large parts of the Hills Hub were on Emergency Lighting, but Volunteers arrived at Emerald's Hills Hub with umbrellas and expectant smiles.

On Thursday 23rd of March, 50 Grade 3 and 4 Students and teaching staff from Menzies Creek Primary School visited the Emerald Library firstly and then met with 25 Volunteers from the Men's Shed, Emerald U3A, the Hub Playgroup and Emerald Glades residents.

The students asked questions - "where were you born?", "how did you come to Emerald?", "what do you celebrate?", "do you have a favourite food?" and the Volunteers answered with stories of growing up in near and far-flung places; some showing photos and ornaments. Lots of tales and laughter were shared and the morning started and finished with a Morning Tea of scones and sausage rolls.

A fortnight later the Volunteer Storytellers have been invited to view their published Biographies and enjoy another Morning Tea in the Classrooms at Menzies Creek Primary School. The Emerald Village Association supported this positive Intergenerational Project.

Emerald Mens Shed

The Emerald Men's Shed was asked to build a GAGA Pit with wheelchair access for the Menzies Creek Primary School.

Once we found out what a GAGA Pit was we said, yes we can do that. The Emerald District Rotary Club pitched in with funding and it was built.

So, what is the GAGA Pit game? - in short it is a ball game:-

A number of players (usually 8) start with one hand touching a wall of the pit.

The game begins with a referee throwing the ball into the centre of the pit.

Once the ball is in play, any player can hit the ball with an open or closed hand.

If a ball touches a player below the knee (even if the player hits himself or herself) he or she is out and leaves the pit. If a player is hit above the knees, the play continues.

If a ball is caught on a fly, the player who hit the ball is out. Players cannot hold the ball. The last player standing is the winner of that round.


What a fantastic week for the Cockatoo Bowls Club!!!!!


