
PUFFING BILLY RAILWAY NEWS

EMERALD AND THE 2021 CENSUS

In August last year Australians were asked to complete a census. These are held every five years. On June 29 the Australian Bureau of Statistics released the first results, which includes profiles of all communities including the Emerald 3782 postcode area. You can find the full Emerald profile at this website: https://www.abs.gov.au/census/find-census-data/quicks tats/2021/SAL20868 This site also compares the data between Emerald, Victoria and Australia. Here are some highlights for Emerald.

- Population 5,890 this was an increase of 112 persons from the last census in 2016
- Median Age is 43 in Victoria and Australia it's 38
- Percentage under 20 years 24.9 (In 2016 it was 26.3) in Victoria it is 23.6 and Australia 23.9
- Percentage over 60 years 25.2 (In 2016 it was 23.7) in Victoria its 22.4 and Australia 23.0
- Country of birth Australia 80%, next is England 6.8%
- No religion 60% (Victoria 38.8%) Catholic 12.5% Anglican 10.1%
- Language used at home other than English Spanish 0.7%, German 0.5%, Japanese 0.5%
- Median Weekly Income Personal \$851, (Victoria \$803), Household \$2,119 (Victoria \$1,759)
- Provided unpaid care for 1 or more children in 2 weeks before Census 30.8% (Victoria 26.3%)
- Did voluntary work through an organisation or group (last 12 months) 18% (Victoria 13.3%)
- Long term health conditions arthritis 9.7%, mental health 9.2%, asthma 8.9%
- Dwellings with 3 or more cars 34.2%, (Victoria 18.4%)
- Dwellings percentage rented 8.3%, (Victoria 28.5%)

EVA MEETING - FERAL RABBITS

Emerald Hopping Mad

Fact - a single pair of rabbits can have up to 164 offspring in eighteen months.

On Wednesday 22nd of April a large group of interested Emerald and surrounds property owners met and listened to Annie and Drew, Biosecurity Officers with the Department of Agriculture, talk about the growing problem of rabbits in Emerald and surrounding districts.

Local residents, Yvette Hayes and Martin Mebalds had asked the EVA to convene a meeting to see if, collectively, residents and neighbours can work with each other to assess the rabbit problem, and work out a co-ordinated solution to managing a growing problem. Residents spoke of damage to fencing, chewing of internet cables, destruction of habitat for wildlife and pasture. Then how to assess numbers and locations, the need for coordinated humane action and detailed information on the types of controls available. Total eradication is not possible, rather a systematic community led collaboration and action plan.

EMERALD COMMUNITY HOUSE NEWS

The Dig In Community Grocery has been nominated and shortlisted for the 2022 Victoria Premier's Sustainability Award. The off grid enterprise operates on a cost recovery method, purchasing food from local suppliers, accepting donations from local growers and retailing at reduced cost. We also resource free food shelves which are open to everyone and keeps food out of landfill.

Our Term 3 short course program includes fire arts workshops (clay, glass and metal works), creative writing, renewable energy and permaculture. Occasional childcare still has some space for under 5s, operating from 9.30-2.30 on Mon, Tues and Friday.

Volunteer opportunities abound in our Children's Hobby Garden which grows food for our childcare programs, Dig In Grocery and volunteer pickings. We have a greenhouse to erect on site for seedlings and propagation as well as new winter plants to add to our many wicking boxes.

We make twice monthly trips to the FoodBank in Dandenong where we purchase and pick up over 700 kg of supplies. Assistance with unloading the trailer and stock the shelves would be appreciated.

Volunteers for the Emerald Market would also be welcome. Our AGM is coming up and we welcome interested people to nominate for our Committee of Management which meets on average 6 times a year. 


