From the EVA President

At the recent AGM we did reflect on the 2023 year and what had been achieved.

Our newsletter EVA "Monthly News" has gone from strength to strength and has been well received in our community and local organisations. Peter Maloney has been the driving force behind this success.

The EVA has conducted a number of community meetings to address local issues. We have had regular contact and support from our ward councillor Jeff Springfield, the Shire of Cardinia, local politicians, the Hills Hub, Cardinia "Connect" and local organisations.

Given the EVA now has nearly 200 members we need to tap into this membership more regularly for input on issues and expertise to extend our programs.

Currently we are seeking feedback on the EVA's proposals to support local members who are objecting to the granting of a permit for a new medical centre without an adequate traffic plan for this project and any future developments. Madigan Way was never designed to cope with the increased volumes of traffic envisaged.

Proposed Medical Centre 337 Belgrave – Gembrook Road

In February this year Council gave notice of a planning permit application for a four-story medical centre with provision for up to 13 doctors and 40 plus car parks accessed from Madigan Way.

The EVA Committee was concerned about the size and design of the building and the capacity of Madigan Way to cope with increased traffic. The EVA Committee agreed to lodge an objection and so did eleven other persons. At the November Cardinia Shire meeting Council resolved to issue a Notice of Decision to Grant a Planning Permit. That meant that all objectors had 28 days to decide whether to lodge an appeal with VCAT to contest the application as proposed. At the EVA Committee meeting on 29 November the Planning Sub-Committee provided a report on the matter and recommended that the EVA should join with at least 4 persons who had already agreed to lodge an appeal.

The Planning Sub-Committee recommended that no EVA funds be used to support an appeal. The EVA Committee passed a motion to add the EVA Inc to the joint appeal to VCAT. The EVA Committee is seeking the views of the EVA members on this issue.

The EVA Committee emphasises that it is not anti-development. Its concerns are that there is no plan for how Madigan Way will be progressively upgraded, how its capacity to handle increased traffic will be managed and what will happen in terms of

traffic and the impact on Emerald as future developments in the area are proposed. The EVA Committee is looking for Council to prepare a long-term plan to ensure good quality development. - The Battle of Trafalgar and the Arts exploring the event and the art, writing, poetry & music emanating from it


- Beauty, Music, Sound & Healing the title says it all!

Emerald Fire Brigade

Our risk in the Dandenong Ranges is most extreme because we are surrounded by forest.

Should a fire occur, you can expect very hot fires and many embers such as twigs and bark from far away, dangerous levels of radiant hear and fire intensity, trees falling in high winds, thick smoke, heavy fuels that will burn for a long time.

Leaving early means being away from high-risk areas before there are any signs of fire.

- What Fire Danger Rating is your trigger to leave?
- Leave the night before or early in the morning?
- Where will you go and what will you take?

To help prepare, consider:

- Packing an emergency kit including toiletries, medicines, mobile phone charger, important documents such as passports, insurance documents, battery powered radio and spare batteries.
- A sufficient supply of medication if you are away from home for a number of days?
- Communicating your fire plan to family, friends and neighbours.
- Pet supplies including bedding, water and food, bowls, collar and lead, favourite toy, proof of vaccination.
- Making sure you have enough fuel in your vehicle.

Staying informed

- Make it a habit to check the Fire Danger Rating every day by visiting the CFA website or call the Vic Emergency Hotline on 1800 226 226.
- Download the VicEmergency App to your phone for warnings and incident notifications
- Listen to ABC Local Radio 774 for warnings.



How and why will a community siren sound?


The siren will sound if there is an emergency incident.

Short period (90 seconds) - indicates a CFA brigade has responded to an emergency incident nearby.

Extended period (of up to 5 minutes) - a current emergency has been identified and you must seek further information immediately.

Emerald Burglaries

As reported in the November edition of the Emerald Newsletter, a series of burglaries took place in Emerald in the early hours of October 29th. Local police set to work behind the scenes to catch these criminals. Here are their reports for the residents of Emerald.

GREAT RESULT FROM HARD WORK

On the 8th of November 2023, Detectives from Cardinia Crime Investigation Unit arrested two males in relation to an alleged series of commercial burglaries committed at Emerald on the 29th of October 2023.

The Sothern Metro Drone Unit played an integral role in assisting detectives with the arrest. A search warrant was executed at an address in Dandenong where a large amount of stolen property was recovered from burglaries that appear to have occurred in Emerald, Rowville, Chadstone, Blackburn South, and several other areas.

A stolen vehicle was also recovered and returned to the owner.

Two males from Dandenong aged 37 and 42 were arrested and have been remanded into custody. They will appear in court later this month.

Here is the Victorian Police report:

On the 8th November 2023, members of the Cardinia Crime Investigation Unit charged a 37 year old male in relation to a series of commercial burglaries that took place between 3.30 and 3.50 am on Sunday 29th October 2023 in Emerald as well as other burglaries committed in Rowville, Blackburn South and Chadstone between 22nd October 2023 and 8th November 2023.

Businesses targeted in Emerald were The General Store café, Gingers Hair Salon, Little Blackbird Clothing Store, Resale Therapy, Barry Plant Real Estate and The Emerald Newsagency.

At least two offenders used a stolen Toyota Hilux in the offending. The second offender is outstanding. Investigators are to make follow up enquiries regarding this.

The 37-year-old male was remanded in custody and will next appear at the Dandenong Magistrates Court for 4thDecember 2023.

(The mention of the 42-year-old male in the Eye watch Circular below is the person who resides

with the 37-year-old. This 42 year old male was charged with unrelated offences to the series of burglaries).

It is clear that the availability of CCTV images is a great help in catching these criminals who invade our town of Emerald.

The Emerald Village Committee has it on their agenda to initiate discussions with the Cardinia Shire Council in 2024 to evaluate the extension of a camera network using the latest technologies available.

A big shout out thank you to our local police force.

We encourage families to follow us on social media and pop in during our borrowing sessions to have a chat and explore the toys we have on offer.


As we are a completely volunteer run organisation we are always grateful for extra help. If you have skills or time to offer we would love to hear from you.

Imagine a warm summer's evening in Emerald Lake Park. A lot of people are mingling on the hill overlooking the Bandstand. Some have brought a simple dinner and are sitting on rugs eating together. Multi-coloured electric candles permeate the crowd and provide colour highlights everywhere.

About 9.00, just on dark, people drift off home. Little kids are asleep now. It's been another great Carols by the Lake.

Emerald Lake Pool - use it or lose it

The ELP pool season commenced on 23 November, until 14 March, between noon and 6:30 pm on open days. The pool will NOT open if the forecast temperature for Emerald at 4 pm the day prior is less than 26 degrees or if heavy rain and lightning conditions are forecast.

Following community feedback, the EVA committee has supported retaining the pool at Emerald Lake rather than removing it and replacing it with a (apparently low key) water feature.

It is not perfect but is the best we have locally for youngsters to cool off and practise safe swimming over the summer season. Even better, Cardinia residents may now park for free at the lake so it is all at no cost to you. (You will need an Annual Emerald Lake Park parking pass - see the Council website.)

In past years, the pool and surrounds have not been well maintained (putting it kindly) which has deterred some residents, by coincidence reducing the recorded pool usage when Council desires to remove it. The shortcomings have been strongly identified to Council which undertook significant maintenance including a repaint of the shell while the lake level was lowered. Council has also been pressed to ensure staff hours and pool chlorination meet user expectations.

Council must entirely cover the pool operating costs, unlike other paid-entry pools in the shire. If enough people do not use the facility, it will not be cost effective and will close ... and you will be driving out of town to give your youngsters a swim. So, get aboard folks – use it or lose it!




