- * Working Bees have been cancelled due to COVID 19, but will commence again when allowed.
- * A Grant from Federal Government "Community Environment Program" has enabled contractors to remove a large number of Sycamore-maple trees from the western forest.
- *A Grant from Melbourne Water has also enabled contractors to remove holly and other woody weeds. These Grants have provided funds for additional weed work to be undertaken and has provided employment for local contractors during this time.
- *Annual "Weedbuster Week" activities have been cancelled including the popular "Trees for Weeds"swap. Check out the Weed Grant available from Cardinia Shire.
- *Seniors Festival walks through Emerald Lake Park and Nobelius Heritage Park and Museum have been cancelled for 2020.
