Well, it was a very windy, coolish night with the doors of our meeting room left open for even better ventilation in Covid 19 times. But the discussion was warm and informative. We talked about future projects in Emerald and Districts and the year ahead...

Trevor Budge and the EVA Planning Committee tabled a statement of purpose and focus they had compiled. It sees the EVA and the Community working co-operatively with the Council, to help complete a new and long overdue Strategic Planning Document. The Planning Committee generally seek to protect the character and livability of Emerald and Districts with new developments being appropriate and able to fulfill the needs of the Community - both now and in the future. They are seeking to meet and talk with Council planning representatives and administrative staff to help set a way forward.

Vanessa Kewish from EVER (Emerald Village Exercise and Recreation Group) told us of the Council's new proposal to bring the Skatepark outlined in the Worrell Reserve Master Plan forward in the Council's planning and budget timetable. This, rather than build a temporary Pop Up Park. The EVA supported this idea and encouraged Vanessa and the Community to build the momentum for this.

We also discussed the Newsletter and the ease of obtaining a copy - to be supplemented by the use of the EVA Website. We need more Members from all ages and stages in the Community.

Membership is free and we are hoping to have some engaging meetings this year.

Peter Cook from the Dandenong Ranges Energy Association spoke to us about the new entrance to Emerald Road sign; a proposal for a Clean Energy Mural to be painted in Emerald and the suggestion for a fast charging port for Electric Cars. And he distributed an "Emerald Solar Town-I Shop Locally" bumper sticker to everyone there!

U3A

Car Parking. With U3A classes resuming at the beginning of February, our president Pat Buoncristiani has been liaising with the Council for more and better options given the time it is taking. It seems the urgency to complete this project is now understood and we have been advised:

The **kerb work** for the whole car park will be done between the 31st January and 13th February (weather depending).

The car parking along the Hills Hub/Library* will then be opened while works in the other section are completed – weather depending, from Monday 14th February.

The opened section* will later be closed for 1 day to completely finish the works.

Covid Issues: It is generally accepted that fresh air or at least quality air is a key factor in preventing the spread of the virus. Spaces within the Hub are mostly open to outside airflow, and the air-conditioning installed has frequent air exchange thanks to the inbuilt CO2 sensors.

Windows in rooms on the upper level cannot be opened, so president Pat has researched air purifying units for the two upstairs training rooms and Art Space. Based on the recommendations of the University of Melbourne, Samsung AX5500K air purifiers with a clean air delivery rate of 467 cubic meters per hour have been chosen and will, together with the CO2 sensors, add significant peace of mind for users of these spaces. These will be purchased and placed in the Hub during the week beginning 31/2/2022. U3A is purchasing these out of our own funds and as filters need to be replaced from time to time and so they will be for the sole use of U3A classes in the Hub. Pat has requested that the Hub purchase a third as the Council is unprepared to supply them for their buildings unless required to by the government.

U3A Membership

Membership with U3A Emerald is on a year-by-year basis, for only \$40 pa. This provides access to numerous classes and activities which promise to provide hours of enjoyment, friendship and learning. Our numbers following the start of the year applications are down on last year.

If you are deterred by the risk of living with Covid, please consider and enquire about the option of joining classes by Zoom during times of widespread presence.

Cardinia Shire Council Grants

The Community Wellbeing Support Grants and Community Capital Works Grant programs are now open. Both grant rounds close on 5pm, Friday 11 March.

Community Wellbeing and Support Grants

This program helps to establish new organisations, projects and services. They can also fund initiatives that improve residents' health and wellbeing, support opportunities for volunteering, as well as those which help to build the capacity of community groups, projects and programs to be sustainable.

Community Wellbeing and Support Grants Program funding categories include:

- Seeding grants
- Volunteering grants
- Small change grants

Community Capital Works Grants

This program assists community groups or organisations managing public facilities, on Council-owned or Crown land. These grants aim to improve community and recreational facilities, to support community networks and, enhance community health and wellbeing.

The Community Capital Works Grant classifications include:

- Category 1 Community and recreation facility upgrades
- Category 2 Partnership grants
- Category 3 Major equipment grants

MARGARET HALL - OAM

(posthumously awarded)



The late Margaret Hall has been awarded a Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) for her service to the community of Emerald.

Margaret (Marg) and her husband Desmond (Des) were drawn to the hills from suburban Melbourne with a weekender purchased in Cockatoo in 1980 with a plan to retire there, which they ultimately did in 1991. They loved the trees, birds and local environment, and soon became part of the Cockatoo and Emerald community. Marg joined the Emerald Uniting Church in 1991, became part of the choir and commenced writing the church's monthly bulletin, which she continued for over a decade.

She undertook various tasks with efficiency and enthusiasm, including church readers, flower rosters and stepping in as a backup for the organist. For the 25 year anniversary of the Emerald Uniting Church, she authored A Church of their Own – 25 Years of the Uniting Church in Emerald.

Marg was a founding member of the Emerald University of the Third Age (U3A), which sought to establish an outlet for members of the local community to continue to learn and share their knowledge and skills. With Des, Marg ran the Armchair Travel Group, sharing their travel experiences across many decades (they met as working travelers in London and married there in 1960) and opened their home for courses and

celebrations. She was also involved with the Garden Group, which was a great outlet for her passion for all things floral.

Always contributing to the communities in which she lived, Marg brought her positive outlook and bubbling personality to helping others. Marg passed away in August 2020.
