The Community Wellbeing and Support Grants Program helps to establish new organisations, projects and services. It also funds initiatives that improve residents' health and wellbeing, support opportunities for volunteering, as well as those which help to build the capacity of community groups, projects and programs to be sustainable.

There are 3 categories:

Seeding grants of up to \$5,000 to support the cost of starting a new organisation, group, club, program, project or service.

Volunteering grants of up to \$3,000 to help create volunteering programs, train volunteers or promote volunteering opportunities.

Small change grants of up to \$1,000 to assist with a range of ad hoc costs that cannot be met through other funding sources, such as buying small items of equipment, website redevelopment, Christmas decorations and more.

EMERALD NETBALL CLUB

The new netball courts at Pepi's Land are currently having rectification works done to the courts surface, as the contractor that did the initial work and lines didn't comply with Council plans, and the requirements of Netball Victoria. These contractors had been back twice in the last 6 months to rectify, but still the problem persisted. The courts will now be resurfaced with a Rebound Ace surface. This will be a grey colour.

Works on this are due to be complete by the end of February. The Club is hoping that then the clubrooms and courts will be handed over to them to use. This year the Club has 10 teams playing at MDNA, and will be running NetSet go clinics for 6-7 year olds in term 2. They have around 100 members...ranging in age from 6 years to 50 years.

THE ROADS PROGRAM

You would be aware that the Shire has received funding to seal certain roads. The Shire's Infrastructure Team headed by Garry Petroff and Andrew Barr briefed the EVA committee on how the road sealing program will be undertaken. A complete list of roads to be sealed can be found on the Shire's web site. The project will take 8 years and first two streets in Emerald are Princess Avenue and Crichton Rd Residents contributions to be capped at \$7000.

After negotiations works are scheduled to start later this year.

FUTURE OF THE HILLS HUB

A number of community groups including the EVA ,U3A and The Mens Shed have concerns about the future funding and management of the new facility. It was felt that Covid severely limited Hub usage in 2020 but we should look forward to 2021 experiencing community usage of this excellent resource.

EVA passed two motions at their recent meeting:

- 1. That Council develop a business plan for The Hub as a matter of urgency AND
- 2. That Council continue the role of Placemaker on a fulltime and ongoing basis.
