EVA MEETING REPORT

Riding the Ups and Downs of Lockdown Life in Emerald Last Wednesday night we switched on and clicked in as the EVA Zoomed together to hear the progress of the Emerald Village Exercise and Recreation (EVER) group's bids to improve Parks and Playgrounds in Emerald; discuss the Emerald Tennis Club's plans for Re-development and review the traffic issues in Eastern Emerald. Despite the difficulties and shutdowns life goes on and plans made now for Emerald's young people and residents help give us a way forward.

Vanessa and Ben Kewish have had lots of ongoing discussions with Cardinia Council Officers and our Councillor Jeff Springfield and have some good news. In the Council plans, for next year and the year after, are a \$50,000 park for Pepi's Land and a \$100,000 refurbishment of the Jump Park at the far end of Pepi's land. They, like the Community, would like to contribute ideas and plans for these areas and it's up to all of us to make sure young voices are heard as these proposed developments roll on. And while you are there read about the progress of the proposed Pop Up Skate Park on the disused netball Courts at Worrell reserve. A Crowd sourcing page has been set up and contributions from individuals, families and businesses are rolling in.

EVER

NEWS from EVER- THE POP UP SKATE PARK!

We'd love your support! EVER- Emerald Village Exercise and Recreation has proposed a "pop up" skate park on the netball courts at Worrell Reserve. Emerald doesn't have a skate park, and the footpaths aren't safe for young ones to ride on. A skate park is planned for Worrell Reserve but works and funding are proposed to start in a few years, so delivery will be many years from now.

COVID lockdown has demonstrated the necessity of outside exercise. A "pop up" skatepark would utilise steel pre-fab ramps, which are bolted to the ground instead of concrete permanent structure. This is an inexpensive way to utilise this space...

We know that our children's mental health is suffering and the time for action is now.

EVER pitched the idea to Cr. Jeff Springfield, and we are currently awaiting permission. EVER has consulted Hita Mistry (local Psychologist) and Ben Kewish (local Physiotherapist), and they agreed this project would be beneficial for physical and mental well-being, vital after the last two years of lock-down. EVA has also ratified the project.

The cost of the project is estimated to be \$25,000. Crowd funding has generated over \$5k from the Emerald community.

Why ? - For the mental health and well being of our local kids

- · Quick and cost effective
- · Can be reused or relocated
- · Gives our community an amenity quickly
