



A Drama by Olwen Wymark Show Dates November 3-12

Olwen Wymark's drama 'Find Me' based on a true story, follows the protagonist Verity Taylor as she is dealing with increasingly damaging mental health issues. Verity's family becomes fractured in their search for answers from a health system, at the time, that does not have answers for Verity's particular case and so doctors and other medical health practitioners find themselves unable to advise Verity's family. #### Items of Interest to Emerald Community

Once again, in September, our Emerald Village Association meeting ranged over a large number of topics that involved us as a Community. As always, you giving us your opinions and even joining the Emerald Village Association helps us shape the Emerald and District that we want now and into the future.

Topics covered and decisions made included:

Planning matters: We heard the decision on the new Medical Centre planning permit on Belgrave-Gembrook Rd has been postponed to November 2023 to allow for investigation into Madigan Way traffic, Vegetation and Privacy concerns.

Cardinia Councillor, Jeff Springfield also told us of the progress on Park's and Reserve's Planning by the Council including Emerald Lake Park, Puffing Billy Reserve and Playground and Pepi's Land Bike Park Upgrade.

The Emerald Tennis Club night lights removal and lack of replacement was also canvassed.

We queried the current use of the Netball Courts at Pepi's Land- could it be used for other Community Sports?

We talked through how the Hills Hub use and management could more effectively happen and decided to pursue the development of a suggested Business Plan in cooperation with the Cardinia Council. Concern was raised about signage in the Township, with the placement of Notice Boards and the removal of old Noticeboards, after their expiry, a noticeable problem. The Compliance section of the Council will be contacted on this issue.

**Communications:** The EVA Newsletter now has 32 sponsors and a new Printer! Thank you to all and Peter Maloney!

**Well-being**: Our Emerald Arts Society Annual Exhibition (3<sup>rd</sup> -7<sup>th</sup> of November) and Emerald Primary School Fair (November 11<sup>th</sup>) are coming up quickly and donations were made to help with both.

Concern was raised on the continued availability to young families of the Puffing Billy Toy Library as its operating Committee has ceased. Without a viable Committee and Volunteers, it will not survive. Do you know some-one who can help? Contact the Hills Hub Council Staff to help..

And finally, based on the success of the "Come Sit By Me" Intergenerational Projects, the Well Being team will meet to discuss possible future plans.

- → Which Fire Danger Rating is your trigger to leave?
- → Will you leave early that morning or the night before?
- → Where will you go? What will you take?
- → What route will you take and what is your backup route if a fire is already in the area?
- → Who else do you need to talk to?
- → What will you do if there is a fire in the area and you cannot leave?



To help support our community, Emerald Fire Brigade will be attending community group meetings and visiting businesses to help everyone understand what to do on severe fire danger days.

#### **Aura Vale Lake Park**

This Tussle with Bureaucracy has a happy ending. Thanks to Monbulk MP Daniela de Martino and local, Marg Edwards. Her report:

"It's pleasing when, on those rare occasions in our lives, we strike success with bureaucracy!

I'm happy to say I've just had one such moment and it involves the Aura Vale Lake at Cardinia Reservoir Park

We visited with our kayak in January this year, on a



hot Sunday when the park was bursting with large family groups enjoying a day's outing. I was dismayed to find the toilet block closed. and a notice nearby stating that Parks Vic were undertaking upgrades to "toilet facilities, picnic tables, BBQs, car parks and signage". "Construction due to start October 2021 to

be completed by Christmas 2021". It was now January 25 2023 and no signs of any action!

My emails to Parks Vic were received with responses about lack of funds, serious issues with the sewerage system and advice that public toilets could be found at Crystal Brook, 2 kilometres away. Not much use to elderly people picnicking with families I thought!

After several futile emails to and fro with Parks Vic I approached the recently elected State Member for Monbulk, Daniela De Martino who followed up and had similar responses.


In April the park was completely closed to the public and more emails ensued. Now this was more than just an issue about lack of toilet facilities. We had been locked out of our own "backyard" so to speak!

I persisted with more emails to Parks Vic and Daniela De Martino, as perhaps did others, and then became sidetracked by life in general.

Four months later I am delighted to have just been advised by Daniela's office that Aura Vale Park was reopened last weekend with 2 portable toilets installed, as I had suggested!

So, sometimes we have a win, and now with summer on its way I'm pleased that the taxpaying public will once again be able to enjoy their beautiful Aura Vale Lake and picnic area."






#### **Emerald Star Bush**


